## Did you know that the OAS offers financial aid for studies in

the United States?

The Organization of American States (OAS), through the Rowe Fund program, grants interest-free loans to Latin American and Caribbean students.

If you are an F or J student visa holder and have been admitted or are currently enrolled in the last two years of undergraduate, master's, or doctoral studies at an accredited university in the United States, you may qualify for funding from the Rowe Fund for up to \$15,000 and simultaneously apply for a supplementary scholarship of \$2,000.

States According to the Institute of International Fund Education (IIE) - Open Doors report, there Latin were 1,248 students from **Trinidad and** 

**Tobago** studying in the U.S. during the 2022-23 academic year.


Overall, the number of international students enrolled in U.S. universities was 1,057,188, with only 81,945 of these from the Caribbean and American region. Latin Within this number, Peru, Mexico, Brazil, and Colombia 54.70% combined represent of international students from the region while Trinidad and Tobago represents just 1.52%.

In existence for over 75 years, the Rowe Fund program was established out of an endowment left by Dr. Leo S. Rowe, former Director General of the Pan American Union, a predecessor of the OAS.
