INFORMATION BULLETIN

1. Venue of the General Assembly:

The thirty-ninth regular session of the General Assembly of the Organization of American States will be held from June 2 to 3, 2009, in the city of San Pedro Sula, Honduras. Meetings will be held at the *Centro Social Hondureño Árabe*.

The inaugural session will take place on Tuesday, June 2, at 09:00 a.m. at the *Centro Social Hondureño Árabe*, and the President of the Republic of Honduras, H. E. José Manuel Zelaya Rosales, and Secretary General H. E. José Miguel Insulza, will be addressing the audience.

3. Hotels:

Through the Hotel Coordination Office, the Secretariat of Foreign Affairs of Honduras will centralize reservation of rooms for the official delegations and participants at the OAS General Assembly in hotels in the city of San Pedro Sula that have been reserved for that purpose.

The Government of Honduras will only defray the accommodation costs of Heads of Delegation of member States; all other delegates will cover their own expenses.

Room reservations will be made strictly in the order in which applications are received. The hotel bill must be paid directly by each participant prior to departure, as is customary in the hotel industry. Reservation requests will only be confirmed if they come with a currently active credit card number and expiration date.

Information concerning each delegation's hotel requirements must be received, without exception, by May 1, 2009. After that date, the Secretariat of Foreign Affairs will not be responsible for the number of rooms and special rates negotiated with hotels for the General Assembly session, and the block of rooms set aside will be canceled automatically.

4. Air transportation:

Delegates are advised to book their round-trip flights directly with the airlines or their travel agencies as far in advance as possible.

5. Luggage tags:

To facilitate arrival and departure formalities in the city of San Pedro Sula, all delegations are kindly requested to use the General Assembly luggage tags that will be provided to them in advance.

6. Requirements for entering and leaving the country:

Member countries whose nationals require visas to enter the country, including delegates holding diplomatic, official, and regular passports, are listed at the end of this Bulletin. Participants who require an entry visa should request one, as the case may be, at Honduran embassies or consulates in their countries.

Departure taxes for persons holding regular passports are currently US\$34.04, or its equivalent in lempiras at the rate of exchange on the date of departure. The amount of the tax is subject to changes by the national aviation authorities.

Health regulations issued by the Secretariat of Health of the Republic of Honduras require that all national or foreign travelers leaving or **entering Honduras from countries** where yellow fever is endemic must receive a yellow fever vaccination. This requirement includes travelers from countries such as: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, French Guyana, Guyana, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, Venezuela, Angola, Benin, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Liberia, Mali, Mauritania, Nigeria, Rwanda, San Tome and Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Tanzania, Togo, and Uganda, .

Immigration offices will require an international yellow fever vaccination certificate, which will be considered valid if the vaccination was given 10 days before entry into Honduras. The certificate is valid for only 10 years.

7. Reception at airport:

The Government of Honduras will arrange for officers to meet all participants at the "Ramón Villeda Morales" International Airport of San Pedro Sula. It is therefore important for delegates to include all their flight information details on the hotel reservation form to be submitted to the National Hotel Coordination Office by no later than May 1, 2009.

8. Ground Transportation:

The Government of Honduras will provide transportation for all delegates from the airport to the official hotels chosen for the event, as well as between the hotels and the *Centro Social Hondureño Árabe*, and to and from all official social events.

9. Registration of participants:

The registration form will be posted on the website: www.oas.org/39ag starting on **March 23, 2009**, and should be completed and sent to the OAS General Secretariat by no later than **May 1, 2009** in order to facilitate registration activities. Late registration for official delegations will take place in the city of San Pedro Sula beginning on May 30, 2009.

In San Pedro Sula, delegates will also be issued identification cards, **which must be worn for all General Assembly activities**, for security reasons. Delegations and other participants are asked to present a copy of their official credentials at the time of registering.

10. Working languages and documents:

The proceedings of the General Assembly will be conducted in the official languages of the Organization: English, French, Portuguese, and Spanish. Simultaneous interpretation will be provided in these languages. Delegations are urged to download all General Assembly documents from www.oas.org/39ag.

11. Communications:

International telephone calls (including collect calls) may be placed at the site of the Assembly session.

12. Medical Care:

The Government of Honduras will provide First Aid medical care for the delegations during meeting hours. An ambulance will be on location at the venues of the various Assembly functions. All expenses incurred must be defrayed by the patient. All delegates are advised to have internationally applicable health insurance.

13. Currency:

The Honduran unit of currency is the lempira. The average market rate as of March 16 is L18.69 to the U.S. dollar. Internationally recognized credit cards are accepted by most hotels and by businesses in general.

14. General information

a. Business hours:

Business hours are from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, and from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Saturdays. The major shopping centers open every day of the week, and close at 8:00 p.m.

Banks are open Mondays through Fridays between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Most government offices operate Mondays through Fridays between 8:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

b. Weather:

At the time of year the General Assembly is held, the average temperature in San Pedro Sula is about 26 degrees Celsius or 78 degrees Fahrenheit.

c. Electricity:

Power supply is 110 volts AC, 60 cycles.

d. Local time:

The local time is 2 hour(s) behind Washington, D.C. in June.

This classification complies with Central American integration, tours, trade, investment, and regional security agreements as mandated by the presidents of the CA-4 member countries.

Within the framework of the agreements on migrant integration, several special visa provisions have been approved which permit foreigners classified under category (b) consular or without consultation or (c) with consultation who fulfill certain established conditions or criteria to be dealt with under a different category from their original one, which can facilitate their travel to one or more Central American countries. They will be informed of such upon presentation of their visa application to a foreign service official, depending on the exception that applies in a particular case.
