The Parties to this Agreement: The Deputy Secretary General of the Caribbean Community, Mr. Louis A. Wiltshire, on behalf of the Caribbean Community, hereinafter referred to as CARICOM, and Ambassador Val T. McComie, Assistant Secretary General In Charge of the General Secretariat, on behalf of the General Secretariat of the Organization of American States (OAS), hereinafter referred to as the GENERAL SECRETARIAT,

Bearing in mind that the fourth regular session of the Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission (CICAD) of the Organization of American States approved the holding in the Caribbean Region in 1988 of a workshop on education in the campaign against drug abuse in cooperation with CARICOM, with funds from the CICAD Specific Fund,

Agree to the following:

ARTICLE ONE: OBJECT

The object of this Project Agreement is to establish cooperation between the GENERAL SECRETARIAT and CARICOM in the holding of a joint OAS/CARICOM Meeting on Education in the Campaign Against Drug Abuse, hereinafter designated as the PROJECT.

The aim of the PROJECT is to assist OAS-CARICOM member states to develop their drug abuse prevention programs in the context of the Family Life Education Guidelines approved by CARICOM and of the Plan of Action: Education in the Campaign Against Drug Abuse approved by CICAD.

ARTICLE TWO: OBJECTIVE

Consistent with the above aims and scope, the objective of the PROJECT is to hold in Grenada, in cooperation with the Government of Grenada, a four-day workshop in November 1988, to be attended by representatives of the Ministries of Education and Health and of the National Drug Commissions of English-speaking Caribbean states, to address the agenda described in the Plan of Operations.

ARTICLE THREE: RESOURCES AND PLAN OF OPERATIONS

The participation of the GENERAL SECRETARIAT in the PROJECT is based on resources made available under the Specific Fund of the Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission (CICAD) for the Program Area entitled "Education in the Campaign Against Drug Abuse", which shall be provided subject to a Plan of Operations to be mutually agreed upon within fifteen days of the signature of this Project Agreement.

ARTICLE FOUR: RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GENERAL SECRETARIAT

The GENERAL SECRETARIAT, through the Executive Secretariat of the Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission, shall provide to the CARICOM Secretariat the following:

- a. Funds not to exceed US\$55,000, on the understanding that any unexpended balance shall be reimbursed to the GENERAL SECRETARIAT.
- b. Personnel and technical services as detailed in the Plan of Operations.

The commitments assumed by the GENERAL SECRETARIAT in this Project Agreement are subject to the allocations authorized by the Secretary General, so that any financial limitation or unforeseen circumstances shall modify or cancel such commitments.

ARTICLE FIVE: RESPONSIBILITIES OF CARICOM

CARICOM shall provide:

- a. With the funds contributed by the GENERAL SECRETARIAT, travel by the most economical means, 5 days per diem allowances and terminal expenses for up to 3 participants from each of the English-speaking OAS/CARICOM member states.
- b. Personnel and services as detailed in the Plan of Operations.

ARTICLE SIX: REPORTS

The financial records of the PROJECT, including documentation to support entries on accounting records and to substantiate charges against this contribution, shall:

- a. Be maintained in accordance with CARICOM's usual accounting procedures, which shall follow generally accepted accounting practices.
- b. Be an integral part of the financial records of CARICOM, which are subject to an independent audit by the external auditors of CARICOM.

CARICOM agrees to furnish to the GENERAL SECRETARIAT a financial report on the PROJECT, along with such other related information as may be requested by the GENERAL SECRETARIAT with respect to questions arising therefrom.

ARTICLE SEVEN: SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any disagreement in the application or interpretation of the provisions of this Project Agreement shall be settled by negotiation between the Parties, or submitted to any other settlement procedure mutually agreeable.


ARTICLE EIGHT: DURATION OF THE AGREEMENT

This Project Agreement shall come into effect on the date of its signature, and shall end on December 15, 1988, or on any later date

that the Parties agree upon in writing. This Project Agreement may be terminated by either of the Parties by notifying the other in writing 15 days in advance.


