

Frédéric Bolduc **Biography** 

Mr. Bolduc was appointed OAS Special Representative in Haiti in January 2012 with the mandate to enhance OAS' contribution to the consolidation of democracy in Haiti through the promotion of peace, security and development.

He began his career in 1998 at Médecins Sans Frontières and with the United Nations Development Programme. He then briefly worked for the Latin American private sector before pursuing a diplomatic career.

In 2003, he became Head of Mission of the Québec Government Office in Miami, promoting trade and development with Latin America and the United States. In 2007, he was appointed Head of Multilateral Affairs of the Québec Government Mission in Washington, representing Québec's interests at the Organization of American States (OAS) within the Canadian delegation. In 2011, he was appointed Director of the Québec Government Office in Washington focusing on economic and institutional relations with the U.S. Administration and Congress.

Mr. Bolduc graduated with a Master's in International Affairs from Columbia University, with specialization in the economic and political development of Latin America and the Caribbean. He also earned a B.A. in International Relations from Florida International University and a Certificate in Medical Sciences from the University of Montreal.
