- Multinational, multilingual staff drawn from 13 countries, united in passion and commitment to public service.



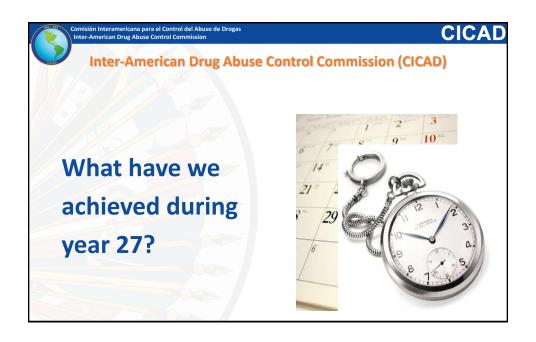

# MEM Sixth Round



- The Sixth Round of the MEM commenced with the transmission of the new Survey, with all 34 CICAD member states providing information for the set of 27 recommendations.
- Two training workshops were held for National Coordinating Entities to familiarize all participants with the new instrument and set of questions in Institutional Strengthening, Demand Reduction, Supply Reduction, Control Measures, and International Cooperation.
- The Governmental Expert Group (GEG) met for a preparatory session in September, and then held its first evaluation drafting session in November 2013 to review and evaluate country responses.

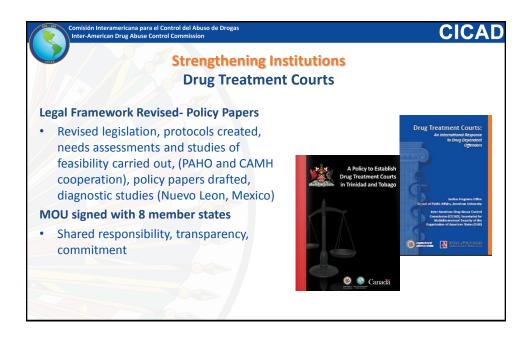
# **Money Laundering Capacity Building**

- Seventeen training activities in nine countries:
   Peru, El Salvador, Brazil, Uruguay, Mexico, Paraguay,
   Honduras, Nicaragua and United States.
- Over 800 participants -- lawyers, judges, prosecutors, police, and intelligence unit analysts trained in the detection, investigation, and prosecution of money laundering cases.

# **Illicit Asset Administration (BIDAL Project)**

- Technical Assistance to the National Commission for Illicit Asset Administration (CONABI) of Peru.

- Training for Penal service professionals conducted





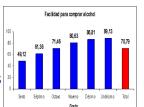






#### **Advances in Research**

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### **Research and Studies**

#### **Treatment Centers in the Caribbean**

- Key indicators were agreed on to identify the characteristics of persons seeking treatment in the Caribbean and a standard form was piloted at centers in 3 countries.
- The results of this pilot and the analysis were published and this report has proven to be a useful resource for other regions.

# **Drugs/Prisons in the Caribbean**

- First multi-country study in four Caribbean countries Primer to study the relation between drugs and crime.
- Comparative analysis of the results published.



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# CICAD - Challenges for 2014

- Declaration of Antigua Follow up: CICAD's contribution for the OAS Extraordinary General Assembly.
- Consolidation of the MEM's new methodology for the Sixth Evaluation Round
- Strengthening of a multidisciplinary group of specialists within ES-CICAD to support member states.
- Improve methodologies for meetings; experts groups; communication strategies; maximize resource allocations, and the potential synergies and results.
- Expansion of donor countries to address new mandates derived from new and current challenges.
