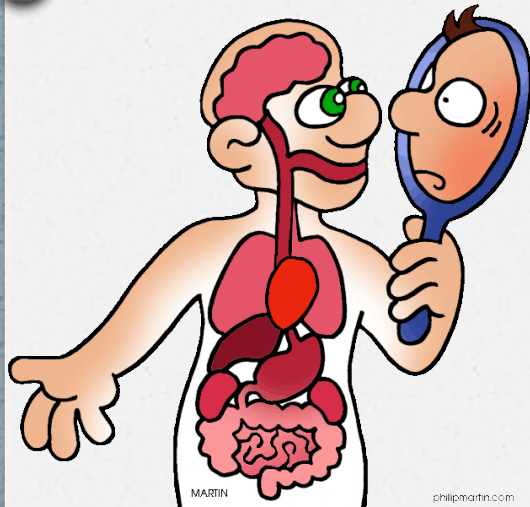
Primary School Programmes

Transition Programme

- Project SOFT - Transitional Programme for youth progressing from primary to secondary school.
- One-week residential camp.
- Children are taught various life skills intended to make them better able to navigate the transition.

Transition Programme

- The Prevention First Club provides the opportunity for participants of Project SOFT to build upon their experiences.
- Also targets the parents of the children and provides practical guidance for them and their adolescent children.
