



Concentration and persistence in some areas of Colombia

- Trends for reduction of illicit crops but a problem of high concentration and persistence in some areas.
- Concentration in 6 departments and from 1,120 municipalities around 204 have presence of coca crops.
- 66% are in special management areas: Parks, Indian Reserves, Community Councils, agroforestry areas.


Poor road conditions and inaccessible areas

If is only action by the threat, the crops diminish, but **if conditions do not change the territorial general trend persists** with other phenomena of illegality (ex. Illegal mining)


Integrated actions against persistent of illicit crops in some areas of the country to ensure sustainability and continuity.

Progress is being made on a policy to strengthen the articulation and coordination among different programs, and strengthen national-regional and sectorial articulation.



Challenges







Implement the new public policy approach that seeks to develop the areas of concerned

Design strategies that address the causes and consequences of the phenomenon from a differentiated intervention.

Implementing the policy approach of vulnerability, human rights, public health, and gender differentiated.

Strengthen the building of evidence to strengthen effective intervention plans.

Establish differential treatment of the weak links in the production chain and intensify efforts in dismantling criminal organizations.

Integration and coordination from the different (national, provincial, municipal) territorial levels to focus efforts and increase the effectiveness of interventions.

Consolidate and coordinate joint worldwide efforts since the phenomenon goes beyond the country's borders.
