BACKGROUND

- ➤ From the COPOLAD II Programme 1st Annual meeting of National Drugs Observatories in Kingston, Jamaica December 5 – 9, 2016 participants agreed National Drug reports of CELAC countries are limited in the integration of different sources of information and are inconsistent in the dissemination of information.
- ➤ 2 Working groups were established under Activity 1.5, with the overall goal to help CELAC countries develop strategies to strengthen their capacity to deliver comprehensive National Reports.





PURPOSE OF REPORT

To acquire initial data on National or Country Reports in 11 Caribbean countries and it is part of a wider report including CELAC countries

Components of Activity 1.5: -

- Survey of existing national or Country Reports among Caribbean countries including a review of the dissemination strategies used by NDOs
- ➤ Preparation of a report on the status of the participating countries about the National Report and communication strategy developed



METHODOLOGY



- ➤ Group 1: Survey among fourteen Spanish speaking countries
- ➤ Group 2: Survey among eleven Caribbean countries - Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Suriname, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago



METHODOLOGY (CONT'D) CONTINUE CONTINUE

Instrument consisted of five closed and five open-ended questions. The closed questions focus on the following areas:

- > Category of persons completing the report
- > Duration of employment at the organisation
- > Preparation of annual reports
- > Types of reports in the past three years
- > Topics in last three years
- Existence of Communication Strategies to disseminate reports
- > Types of communication strategies.



METHODOLOGY(CONT'D) CONTINUE C

The open-ended questions addressed:

- Challenges NDO's currently face in producing a National Report
- Measures that could be applied to overcome barriers in delivering a National Report
- Obstacles hindering implementation of communication strategy
- > The rating of the dissemination experience
- Expected results from participation in COPOLAD project



DATA ANALYSIS



- > Results are based on responses from 9 of the 11 countries
- > Descriptive statistics were used to report demographic and other quantitative variables in the survey.
- ➤ Questions 4, 5, 8, 9, and 10 (qualitative items) coded before statistical analysis.
- > Absolute numbers rather than percentages were used to present the data.
- ➤ The Statistical Packages for the Social Sciences (SPSS) was used to analyse the data.

Figure 1: Category of Persons Completing the Survey









Figure 2: Duration of Employment at **Organization**

Figure 3: Preparation of Annual Reports/Updates on the National Drug Situation








Figure 4: Types of Reports Produced in the Past 3
Years









Figure 5: Topics of Reports Produced in Past 3 years
















Figure 7: Measures/Actions that can be Used to Overcome the Obtacles Hindering the Preparation of a Report on the National Drug Situation








Figure 8: Countries' Use of Communication Strategy to Ensure Dissemination of Reports








Figure 9: Communication Strategy Components for Countries which have a Communication Strategy








Figure 10: Obstacles Hindering the Design/Implementation of a Communication Strategy








Figure 11: Rating of NDO Dissemination Experience on a Scale of 1 to 10









Figure 12: Results Expected from COPOLAD Project







Overall Findings

- ➤ Little emphasis placed on international cooperation, research on specific populations and international cooperation.
- ➤ Reliance on Drug Information Network (DIN) Reports and Secondary School Surveys to inform on the drug situation.
- Lack of a communication objective for each stakeholder and the absence of a wider public relations strategy.





Findings Cont'd

- ➤ The inability to access proper training was a major hindrance to preparing National Reports.
- ➤ Respondents recognised the need to acquire the appropriate technical skills to present and disseminate reports





Recommendations

- ➤ Promote a more in-depth understanding of data and its contribution to programming and public policy on drug use and abuse.
- ➤ A further assessment of training needs as it relates to the collection of data and the development and dissemination of national reports
- > The implementation of a training plan based on identified needs
- Promoting local stakeholder investment in training
