- " Picture it, Port of Spain, May 2001"
- National Drug Council established in 2000
- Named as National Coordinating Entity for the MEM in its mandate
- Secretariat established May 2001
- Silo culture in effect Demand VS Supply

The First Round



- The Chairman of the NDC was also chair of CICAD
- He had the opportunity to present the MEM at a series of forum
- He understood the MEM
- Was able to guide his new staff
- Staff of CICAD were responsive to requests for clarification

- The Round was already in progress
- Another agency had assumed responsibility
- Council was still new No respect or support from that agency
- Reluctance to relinquish the process
- No systems to support the process at the NDC

The Challenges

The 2nd Round – Picking up Speed



- Systems put in place Started our National Drug Information
 System (NDIS Later became the Drug Information Network (DIN)
- The NDC had full control of the data collection process
 - Still some resistance from the previous agency
- The CICAD Executive Secretariat undertook a capacity building exercise in T&T with stakeholders
- NDC staff more confident of their role
- Things are really looking up
- A MEM team is convened Stakeholders understand –No Punishment !!!

3rd- 6th Round - Trinidad and Tobago's benefits

- Fully Operational Systems
 - MEM Team Engaged Stakeholders Reduction of siloes
 - Drug Information Network (DIN)
 - Foundation offers support Early Warning Systems –COPOLAD
- Received capacity building assistance for our National Plans
- Developed our last three National Plans on the foundation of the MEM
- Finalized a number of international instruments
- Development and passage of various pieces of legislation
- ▶ Consistent support from the Executive Secretariat of CICAD
- Full participation in all aspects of the MEM
