

# **CURRENT STATE OF KNOWLEDGE**

Extensive information and resources are available for people wanting to use participatory approaches

There is extensive theoretical and practical literature on participatory approaches, e.g. for

- Research
- Intervention design
- Monitoring and evaluation

Arguably, the big block is institutional capacity and political willingness to use these methods

This course aims to start filling this gap Information about how to organize and manage rural enterprises is not widely available

There is good information on the early stages of the value-chain approach

- Good material on value-chain/market research
- Good material on enterprise planning and development (e.g. FAO/CIAT)

There is less little detailed information about what to do after a Development Oriented Rural Enterprise has been developed






