

## **Carlos Muñoz**

Carlos Muñoz is Mexican, and holds a Masters Degree in Environmental Economy from the University College of London (poverty and deforestation), and a Ph.D. in Agricultural and Natural Resources Economy (Natural Resources and Public Policy) from Berkeley University in California. He was a consultant for Mexico City Government, the London Environmental Economic Center, the World Bank, and an adviser for Resources Renewal Institute, where he was in charge of analyzing public policies, among other duties. He was the Director of Environmental Economy for the Division of Economic and Social Analysis of the Secretariat for Social Development from 1992 to 1994. Mr Muñoz has taught environmental economy and public policy in the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (1992 and 2002), College of Mexico (1993), and in Berkeley University (1998-2000).
