

David Hunter

David Hunter is assistant professor and director of the Program on International and Comparative Environmental Law at American University, Washington College of Law and is currently the Harvard Visiting Professor of International Environmental Law. He is also the director of the Washington Summer Session on Environmental Law. He is the former executive director of the Center for International Environmental Law and was previously an Associate with the law firm of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher and Flom. He currently serves on the Boards of Directors of the Environmental Law Alliance Worldwide-US, EarthRights International, the Project on Government Oversight, the Bank Information Center, and Greenpeace-US. His research and advocacy work covers a broad range of global environment and development issues, including: multinational corporate responsibilities, ozone depletion, and the role of international financial institutions. In 1998, Mr. Hunter *co-authored* *International Environmental Law Policy*, a text for classroom and reference use for academics practitioners, and policymakers. He is a 1983 graduate of the University of Michigan with majors in economics and political science, and a 1986 graduate of the Harvard Law School.
