1. CLIMATE CHANGE AND CLEAN ENERGY



Juan Monticelli is the Sustainable Energy Chief of the OAS Department of Sustainable Development. He delivers technical assistance and policy advice for the advancement of clean energy in Latin America and the Caribbean. Juan has extensive experience in the implementation of renewable energy projects. He facilitates high-level energy and climate dialogue among member states, as well as the exchange of best practices and experiences. Juan authored several documents on energy policy and regulation, climate change, electric mobility, and resilience in the Americas. Juan is an attorney-at-law, licensed by the State of New York in the U.S., and the city of Buenos Aires in Argentina. He holds a Law degree from Universidad Católica Argentina and a Master of Laws degree from The George Washington University, where he specialized in Intellectual Property. He then coordinated the Latin America and Caribbean program at the International Renewable Energy Agency in Abu Dhabi (2015-2017), focusing on the Central American Clean Energy Corridor. Between 2018 and 2022, he oversaw Energy and Environment at the U.N.'s Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean. Since 2023, he has been the Senior Officer and Climate Change section head at the OAS in Washington DC. He holds degrees in Atmospheric Sciences and Meteorology, a Master's in Solar Energy, a master's in risk Prevention Engineering, and a Doctorate in Renewable Energies and Material Flow.
