ITEN Teacher Fellows and Project Team members provide **emergency training** in online teaching.

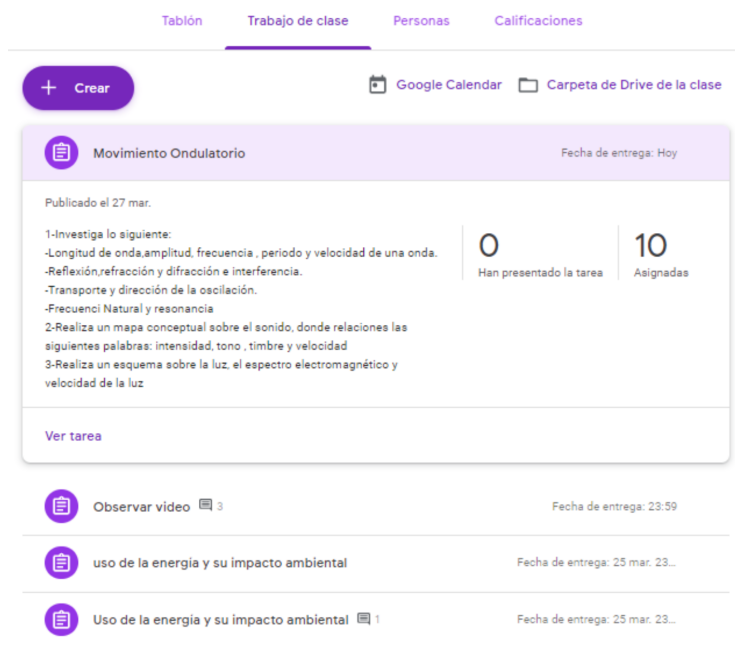
On **23 and 24 March**, ITEN Teacher Fellow **Sandra Guerrero** provided two impromptu online trainings in the use of Google Classroom as a teaching platform for teachers in the Dominican Republic.

The online sessions came about as a result of Sandra's receiving numerous personal calls from colleagues at the onset of the quarantine. Viewing Sandra as a resource, dozens of teachers contacted her when they realized the need to teach online.



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**teachers** participated in Sandra's online workshops, which included concrete examples of how to build online science units, such as the one above, which includes watching **videos** and creating a **concept map** to understand **wave motion**.

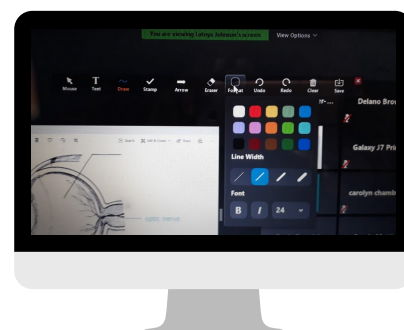


From **31 March - 8 April**, ITEN Teacher Fellow **Bhagya Malladi** and STEM teacher educator **Conroy Hall** collectively provided four days of online training to the science teachers of Jamaica through an initiative of the **Association of Science Teachers of Jamaica**.

The workshop, which was developed in response to a call from the country's teachers via their national WhatsApp group included the use of various free, digital tools for teaching interactively, including Edpuzzle, Kahoot, Nearpod, and Padlet.

National chairman of the association, Elaine Williams, acknowledged Bhagya for her "sacrificial service to the organization and to the professional development" of her colleagues.
