

Responses to clarifications

1. Our company is incorporated outside the US; we would like to confirm if we can use the W-9 form
R. According to the RFP item 7.3 (d) companies outside of the US should send a copy of the W9, however, they must obtain all of the permission and insurance to work in the US.
2. Regarding our personnel in the USA, what documents should we submit to execute the project?
R. According to the RFP, there is no specific documentation required for the personnel, however, the bidder must show the suitability of the offered personnel for this project
3. How many cabling points are there for each location?
R. Please refer to the documentation. New APs will require a new cable. Some from the current location might be reused, but that had to be determined during the walk-thru last week.
4. Is the conduit or ductwork currently in place, or does it need to be supplied?
R. Already in place
5. Is it mandatory to use PANDUIT wiring, or can COOMSCOPE wiring of the same category be used?
R. As long as is the same category and small factor (small in diameter), any brand can be used
6. Are electrical points currently available to power the Access Points, or do they need to be supplied?
R. New APs are PoE, and no power outlet is required.
7. What is the schedule and working days?
R. Monday to Friday during business hours 9to5PM EST
8. Are there available spaces in the racks, patch panels, etc., for the new points in each location?
R. This was discussed during the site survey, please review the information uploaded
9. To calculate exact quantities, is it possible to access the distribution plans for each site?
R. Please refer to the documentation from the survey
10. Should the points be delivered certified with any specific equipment reference?
R. All new cables should pass cable certification. Usually, we have done this in the past with Fluke network equipment.
