Background:

The Organization of American States (OAS), through the Government of Chile Scholarship and Training Project for CARICOM Countries, invited citizens of CARICOM member states to participate in a Disaster Field Operations Course offered by the Academy for International Disaster Preparedness of Florida International University (FIU), on July 13 – 15, 2018.

The Course attracted working professionals from the Caribbean with backgrounds or work-related duties in emergency management and disaster response, including first responders, law enforcement and emergency management personnel, policymakers, program directors, urban planners, NGOs, public health workers and practitioners from the private sector.

Scholarship Recipients and Benefits:

After a careful review of the merits and overall credentials of the candidate, including academic and professional background, and indicators of the highest potential for impact upon return to their countries of origin, twenty (20) awardees were selected to receive the scholarship with benefits including, full tuition, including meals, uniforms, transportation costs and housing; a round-trip economy class ticket to and from Miami; two nights hotel accommodation in Miami; and travel insurance. Due to visa application issues, one of the awardees was not able to participate in the Course. The table above informs of the nineteen (19) scholarship recipients who participated in the Course.

The recipients were responsible for books and study materials, visa charges (if applicable), health insurance, and any additional living and study costs not provided by the scholarship.
