Background:

The Organization of American States (OAS), through the Government of Chile Scholarship and Training Project for CARICOM Countries, invited citizens of CARICOM member States to participate in a Water Management and Irrigation Technologies for Smallholder Development and Irrigated Agriculture in Times of Climate Change (a combined course tailored to the Caribbean) or a Crisis and Mass Disaster Management Course at the Galilee International Management Institute (GIMI) in Israel from December 4 – December 17, 2018.

The Courses attracted working professionals from the Caribbean with backgrounds or work-related duties in emergency management and disaster response, including first responders, law enforcement and emergency management personnel, policymakers, program directors, urban planners, NGOs, public health workers and practitioners from the private sector.

Scholarship Recipients and Benefits:

After a careful review of the merits and overall credentials of the candidate, including academic and professional background, and indicators of the highest potential for impact upon return to their countries of origin, twenty-two (22) candidates were selected to participate in the Courses. At the end of the scholarship process, a total of thirteen (13) awardees accepted the scholarship offer to attend the Courses.
