## REQUEST FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF EQUATORIAL GUINEA TO ACCREDIT A PERMANENT OBSERVER TO THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES

THE PERMANENT COUNCIL OF THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES,

### HAVING SEEN:

The request presented by the Government of Equatorial Guinea to be granted the status of Permanent Observer to the Organization of American States (CP/doc.1748/86); the information provided by the General Secretariat on the possible contribution that country could make to the Organization's programs (CP/CAJP-658/87), and the Report of the Committee on Juridical and Political Affairs on the request in question (CP/doc.1780/87), and

### CONSIDERING:

That through resolution AG/RES. 50 (I-0/71), the General Assembly established the status of Permanent Observer in the Organization of American States and charged the Permanent Council with establishing the criteria and the timeliness to give effect to that provision and implement it, and

That pursuant to resolution CP/RES. 407 (573/84), any independent State may request the status of Permanent Observer to the Organization, in accordance with resolution AG/RES. 50 (I-0/71),

### RESOLVES:

1. To accede to the request from the Government of Equatorial Guinea to be granted the status of Permanent Observer to the Organization of American States, in accordance with the terms of resolution AG/RES. 50 (I-0/71) of the General Assembly and resolution CP/RES. 407 (573/84) of this Council.

2. To invite the Government of Equatorial Guinea to accredit a Permanent Observer in the organs, agencies and entities of the Organization, in accordance with the provisions of operative paragraph 7 of resolution CP/RES. 407 (573/84).

3. To request the Secretary General to report the foregoing to the organs, agencies and entities of the Organization, including the inter-American specialized organizations, once the Government of Equatorial Guinea has been informed of this decision.
