



Dr. Betsy Peterson is Director of the American Folklife Center (AFC) at the Library of Congress. She holds an M.A. and Ph.D. in folklore from Indiana University. For nearly three decades she has been producing, developing and administrating cultural programs throughout the United States. Prior to joining the AFC in 2012, Peterson worked as a cultural consultant and served as Executive Director of the Fund for Folk Culture (2004-2009). She also served as Director of Folk and Traditional Arts at the New England Foundation for the Arts and was a co-founder of Texas Folklife Resources in Austin, Texas. In her consulting practice, her past clients have included The Wallace Foundation, South Arts, the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation, Carnegie Hall, The Ford Foundation, the American Folklore Society and the National Endowment for the Arts, for whom she wrote, edited and compiled *The Changing Faces of Tradition: A Report on the Folk and Traditional Arts in the United States*, published in 1996. Dr. Peterson has written, produced or edited a number of publications and media recordings, reports and commissioned articles for organizations as the South Arts, Asia Society, the Pew Fellowships in the Arts, and Animating Democracy.
