REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS ON THE ACTIVITIES WITH PERMANENT OBSERVERS

FIRST TRIMESTER 2013

(January 1 to March 31, 2013)

I. INTRODUCTION

This financial management report provides a comprehensive summary of the activities carried out by the Secretariat for External Relations /Department of International Affairs from January 1 to March 31, 2013 to promote voluntary cooperation with Permanent Observer pursuant to Resolution AG/RES. 1 (XLII-E/12) rev. 2 Paragraph III.A.2.b and c, which request the General Secretariat to present its administrative and financial management reports to the CAAP on a quarterly basis, including an executive summary. These reports are intended to serve as a comprehensive management guide to the strategic allocation of resources and to report on the General Secretariat's compliance with mandates of the General Assembly that address policies affecting administration, management, and programs, as well as to report on variances, and highlight budget transfers when applicable."

As described in Executive Order 08-01 rev. 5 the Department of International Affairs (DIA), as part of the Secretariat for External Relations, is responsible for coordinating the relations with the Permanent Observers with the goal of providing information regarding the mission of the Organization and the priorities of the hemispheric agenda. The General Secretariat also identifies opportunities and negotiates financing and cooperation agreements with the Permanent Observers to obtain substantive support for the programs of the General Secretariat.

In its efforts to strengthen the Organization's ties with the Permanent Observer Missions, the General Secretariat has streamlined the sharing of information regarding the OAS' priorities and the hemispheric agenda, as well as obtained substantive financial and in-kind support for OAS activities.

Through informational meetings, the negotiation and presentation of projects, resource mobilization, promotion of special events and exchanges of information, the General Secretariat facilitated the active participation and collaboration of Permanent Observers in the activities and cooperation programs of the Organization.

II. MOBILIZATION OF FINANCIAL AND IN-KIND RESOURCES

Throughout the first trimester of 2013, based on the foreign policy objectives and international cooperation priorities of the Permanent Observers, DIA developed a strategic plan for resource mobilization of external funds in response to the mandate AG/RES. 1 (XLII-E/12) rev. 2 Paragraph A. 3 "To instruct the Secretary General, as part of his fundraising efforts, to promote and encourage, through the Secretariat for External Relations, in coordination with member states, support for the implementation of the mandates of the General Assembly, and to submit a report to the CAAP on an annual basis on the results of these efforts."

As a result of these resource mobilization efforts in conjunction with the OAS technical areas, the Organization has received as of March 31, 2013 funding of US\$4,381,798.68 in cash contributions to support different programs across all OAS technical areas and dependencies as shown in the chart below.
