The review of the system plan will be dependent on the acceptance of the sites referenced in 3.2 and their designations, on the completion of the studies of those priority potential protected areas referenced in 3.3, completion of the local area plans by the Physical Planning Unit by 2015 and increased knowledge of Grenada's natural and cultural resources.

Pending resolution of the legislation and institutional arrangement issues and any resulting amendments as addressed in Part 2 of the system plan, the plan review should be conducted by the National Parks Advisory Council and the Management Committee for marine reserves and should focus on the progress made in designation of terrestrial and marine sites as well as impediments encountered.

The review should consider recommendations in management plans that deal with changes to protected area designation, such as upgrading forest reserves to national parks or the reverse, establishment of new protected areas and national land use decisions that preclude designation of proposed protected areas because of higher priority needs. A formal plan review should occur every 7 years and should be conducted in a public forum.
