



Inter-American Committee on Ports First Hemispheric Convention on Port Logistics and Competitiveness

- 1. <u>Background:</u> The Eleventh Meeting of the Executive Board of the Inter-American Committee on Ports (CECIP), held in Panama City, Panama, March 2010, approved Resolution CIDI/CECIP/RES. 11(XI-10), regarding the celebration of the "First Hemispheric Convention on Port Logistics and Competitiveness" in Mexico on the second semester of 2010. In this regard, the General Coordination of Ports and Merchant Marine of the Secretariat of Communications and Transports (SCT) with the support of the Integral Port Administration of Lázaro Cárdenas (APILC), both from Mexico, and with the Secretariat of the Inter-American Committee on Ports (CIP) of the Organization of American States (OAS) agreed to the organization of this event.
- **2.** <u>Objectives:</u> To generate a forum for analysis, discussion and exchange of experiences on policies, strategies and actions planned or carried out by Member States of the OAS and other organisms, national and international which promote the design of programs to help improve the conditions to heighten competitiveness in their markets and to increase the use of logistics as a key factor for success; being these attractive elements for investments and the economic development of their nations.
