LEDA (Drug Legislation in the Americas)

 Continued progress toward developing a hemispheric database on drug legislation and regulations





Accomplishments: Multilateral Evaluation



MEM Sixth Round



- The Sixth round evaluation instrument, adopting a new focus and based on the CICAD
 Hemispheric Drug Strategy and Plan of Action, was drafted by the Intergovernmental
 Working Group (IWG), for Commissioners' consideration and approval.
- Sixth evaluation round to start in the early 2013: National Coordinating Entities (NCEs)
 will receive training and the evaluation survey will be sent out during the first quarter of
 2013.





Drug Information Networks

Supported several training, data collection and reporting exercises in an effort to further develop national drug information networks in Central America and the Caribbean.

Caribbean Drugs/Prisons

- Carried out first multi-country survey of prisoners in four
 Caribbean countries to study relationship between drugs and crime
- Published comparative analysis of the results.







Drug Treatment Courts - Caribbean

- Trinidad launches first drug treatment court and first policy paper
- More than 100 professionals benefit from study visits (Toronto, Miami)
- Ongoing progress in Jamaica and The Bahamas.
- Interest in Belize and Grenada







Drug Treatment Courts Central America

- Costa Rica signs MOU with plans to launch first courts in early 2013
- Dominican Republic approves MOU
- Progress in Panama and El Salvador
- More than 100 professionals benefit from study visits (Nashville, Santiago)

- Based on indicators of human behavior

Control of chemical diversion/synthetic

drugs:

- Clandestine labs and officer safety

Accomplishments: Capacity Building



- **Management of Seized Assets (BIDAL)**
- Currently implemented in El Salvador and the Dominican Republic
- Requests from Brazil, Peru and Guatemala.
- Supported other projects "Model laws for Asset Forfeiture" UNODC and "Asset Recovery Network of GAFISUD (RRAG)"

PROCCER Central America

- 302 participating governmental and non-governmental drug treatment Institutions
- 12 participating universities
- 1572 drug treatment counselors trained





Accomplishments: Capacity Building



PROCCER Mexico

- Conducted country-wide diagnostic to determine institutional, human resource, and patient profiles
- Adapted the PROCCER treatment curriculum
- Performed a competency-based evaluation of practicing human resources in six pilot states
- Conducted basic level training to 600 drug treatment counselors in six pilot states




