Introduction n National drug strategies of several countries set the goal of: "Reducing drug use by x% in x years" OID-CICAD/OAS




Reducing drug use n Know where we are Ø (1) Diagnosis n Do something about it Ø (2) Intervention n Know what happened Ø (3) Evaluation

Current situationOID/CICAD role in assistance on Research


- n The OID/CICAD delivers technical and financial assistance for research on drug use

- n Has standardized methodologies for research in the countries






































Alcohol and Drugs n Alcohol is the substance most consumed in all the countries n It is responsible for a large proportion of accidents and deaths, and for demand for treatment
















Future Challenges n Importance of having timely and reliable information n The need for research
