08:30	Document 1: Guide for justice system agencies involved in the prosecution of maritime narcotics trafficking cases Briefing: <i>During the meeting of the Expert Group in 2014, a working group led by Colombia was created to develop a guide to assist judicial officials understand maritime narcotics trafficking cases. The guide would promote</i>
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consciousness about maritime operations against narcotrafficking. The working group managed to develop a draft table of content.

After the meeting of the Expert Group in 2014, the Executive Secretariat of CICAD circulated the draft outline to all participants for their consideration and input. It was requested that the contributions were sent to the president of the working group. The draft guideline would be prepared by Colombia and presented for consideration of the Group of Experts during the 2015 meeting.

This official provides the necessary authority to stop, board, examine, inspect, search and seize vessels of the nationality or registry of his/her country, which are suspected of being involved in illicit trafficking. Under this agreement, the law enforcement vessel would have the authority to take law enforcement action under either State's jurisdiction.</i></p>
