

MAIN CHALLENGES TO ASSET RECOVERY

- Lack of Funding

- Inadequate Training: in Tracing, Investigating and Management of Seized Assets
- Inadequate Legal Framework Civil Forefeiture

Agreement For the Return and Sharing of Recovered Assets

- Collaboration with Strategic Partners
 - –UNODC (With Assistance from the UK Crown Prosecution Office)

Agreement For the Return and Sharing of Recovered Assets

- This Agreement aims to fairly and clearly articulate the rules of asset return and sharing, designed to protect the interests of both requesting and requested States Parties...
- Builds on the provisions outlined in the <u>Caribbean Mutual Legal Assistance</u> <u>Framework</u>

Main Features of the Agreement

- 1. Facilitate cooperation between Parties in the Return and Sharing of Recovered Assets
- 2. Clear illustration of the guidelines for the Return and Sharing of Assets Amongst the Parties
- 3. Attention to Victims
- 4. Provisions for the financing of national and regional security institutions

BENEFITS To CARICOM Agreement For the Return and Sharing of Recov'd Assets

- Collaboration among member states in dismantling criminal enterprises in the region
- Promotes the safety and security of each member state and the CARICOM region
- Strengthens the existing <u>Caribbean Mutual</u>
 <u>Legal Assistance Treaty</u>
