Stigma hinders reintegration.

Need education awareness to reduce stigma in the community.

Using clubs, and university students for placement and utility of their skills, example Social Work students may use their skills and assist graduands of the drug court; inter-island exchanges of graduates from programmes so there is cross fertilization or exchange of ideals, for periods of say up to 6 months. Education for families, so they accept and be engaged in the process of forgiving the past indiscretion of their family members.

May use advertisements during peak periods like rush hour to spread the message of reintegration to mass audiences.

Use persons Usain Bolt, Brian Lara, of significant standing, and celebrities like Rihanna, can attract attention to the message by their testimonies of the positive work the reintegration of formally disconnected citizens.

Persons from civil society, business person, educators, churches, companies and the diaspora to buy into the programme of reintegration and provide financial and other moral support.

Encourage resettlement programmes—by teaching life skills, social skills, and remedial courses. Provide

Provide job placements, housing placements, such programmes have to be regulated and standards set to maintain the integrity of the programme, encourage abstinence and prevent relapse.
