- The Research Department of the NCSA carries out the technical functions of the Observatory e.g. collection and analysis of data, report preparation, etc.

- Prepared and published 2013, 2014 & 2015 reports
- In the process of preparing 2016 report
- Participating in COPOLAD projects within region
 - National reports and early warning systems

Status & Recent Activities (2016 & 2017)

Conducting a Primary School Needs Assessment

- Aim of the Assessment: To improve the delivery of the primary school drug education programme offered by the NCSA
- A combination of quantitative & qualitative methods were used to collect the data (interviews – focus group & individual; questionnaires) from students, teachers, principals, NCSA volunteers responsible for delivering the programme, coordinator of the NCSA primary school programme
- Draft report recently completed
- Results will be used to inform the revision of the primary school programme (content & delivery)

Barbados Drug Information Network (BARDIN)

- Had many stops & starts
- Restarted in 2011 & currently an active DIN
- To date, 5 reports have been published (2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015) & the 6th report is being prepared





Psychiatric Hospital: Gender Comparisons 2011 - 2015



Psychiatric Hospital: Age Comparisons 2011-2015




Psychiatric Hospital: Single Drug Use vs. Poly Drug Use 2011-2015




Psychiatric Hospital: Common Drugs of Choice Common drugs used by persons seeking treatment for polydrug & single drug use include:

New Drugs in Barbados

- No <u>official</u> reports
- Anecdotal reports of synthetic marijuana (e.g. Hydro, K2, Spice) from treatment centres and volunteers
- Anecdotal reports of mixtures involving cough syrup from volunteers and Programme Officers (cough mixture, sprite, Jolly Ranchers)

Challenges Faced by the Observatories

- Timely submission of data/information from agencies
