# Challenges

Inconsistency in data collect and analysis

- Saint Lucia does not have mechanisms to detect the purity of drugs
- The United States Government announced in 2013, a policy decision based on Leahy Law to withdraw training and material assistance to the Royal St Lucia Police Force
- Closing of Forensic Lab
