INDRODUCTION AND OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP

In the last decades, many countries in Latin America and the Caribbean have introduced criminal sanctions as a strategy to answer to drug use and drug related crimes. This strategy resulted in a high number of incarcerated women and men for drug related crimes, ranging from simple drug possession to microtrafficking or small-scale drug cultivation and processing. Member states recognize that incarceration might be armful for those who have committed offenses, their families, and in the long term their communities as well. However, many of their laws do not make distinctions, or apply discretion, to different levels of involvement in the drug problem, which can lead to gender inequities or discrimination. The objective of this workshop is to coordinate and follow up on the diagnostic study on the alternatives to incarceration for drug related crimes under a gender perspective, in the framework of the Project: Gender and the Criminal Justice System: Exploring evidence-based alternatives to incarceration for drug related crimes.
