- Rights of migrants
- Rights of Older Persons

The evaluation Committee will select up to 4 papers. **The winners will have an opportunity to present virtually their paper at the Permanent Council of the OAS on December 5.**

To be considered, your submission must meet the following criteria:

- Be in One of the four languages of the OAS (English, French, Portuguese, Spanish)
- Should not exceed 4 pages (approximately 1000 words)
- Sources for quotations and references must be clearly identified
- The topic must be selected among the ones listed above and answer the questions: How do
 the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the American Declaration of the Rights and Duties
 of Man, or the Inter-American Convention on Human Rights have helped you and your
 community to advance human rights? What have been the challenges? What have been the
 successes? And what would you recommend?
