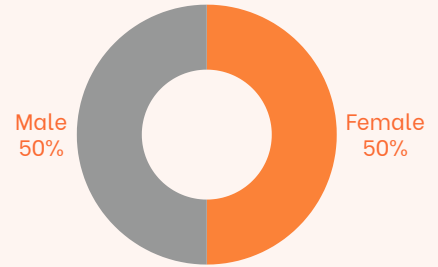


Evaluation Survey Report - "Peer to Peer Technical Cooperation Round", Guatemala

Believe that their institution would be interested in benefiting from future IASPN rounds of cooperation and technical assistance.

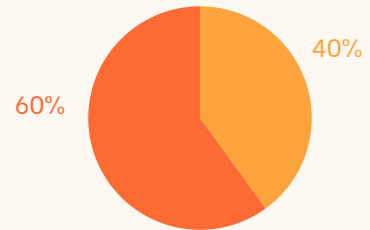
Considered that the cooperation provided practical information and resources that can be implemented in the process of updating the National Policy on Disability.

Suggestions



- I suggest having predefined guidelines for technical assistance and being able to standardize among peers, for example, structure of presentation contents (power point); matrices for hearings and/or interviews; consider a couple of activities with civil society in the field.
- Continue accompanying the beneficiary country until the objective is achieved, in case they request it.
- I believe that the time of the on-site visit should be extended, since the space for sharing experiences was short and there was no time to delve into them.
- Share the policy documents to be presented by the specialists a couple of weeks in advance of the visit in order to know and analyze these documents in greater depth.
