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CooperaNet User Manual

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Introduction

CooperaNNet is a response from the Organization of American States' Executive Secretariat for Integral Development (OAS/SEDI) to Member States' mandate to facilitate regional and multi-sectoral cooperation for development.

In 2018, Member States' High-Level Cooperation Authorities highlighted a series of recommendations for action:

- Increase regional coordination on cooperation through the OAS, strengthening engagement with and among Cooperation Authorities.
- Support Member States in identifying and accessing existing and emerging funding and technical assistance opportunities.
- Build a database of practices on specific topics by and for the Member States.
- Provide an ongoing forum for Member States' Cooperation Authorities.
- Enable the undertaking of joint solutions to similar development problems.
- Realize the potential of the OAS as an impartial mediator, catalyst, and facilitator of partnerships with other stakeholders.
- Use available technologies and tools to further such engagement.

The CooperaNNet online platform offers a consolidated space to optimize partnerships, build alliances and networks, leverage development assistance, and provide more demand-driven technical cooperation in the Americas while also facilitating the regional attainment of the SDGs. The online functionalities available to the Member States and other actors were designed to position them better to lead, engage, partner, and create innovative solutions to development challenges.

To access all of the platform's functionalities, users must join the CooperaNNet community as one of three types of potential users:

- **Member States:** Users associated with the public sector of the OAS Member States. These users may indicate needs in their specific industry and match available cooperation offers and needs.
 - **Institutional Unique Accounts (Previously Cooperation Focal Points):** The Cooperation Authorities of the Member States have been assigned **Unique Country Accounts** that act as **Cooperation Focal Points**. These are the only accounts that can make offers of cooperation or share good practices on behalf of their country, indicate needs in their specific sector and "match" to available cooperation offers and needs, and edit the information contained in the Authority's profile. Be aware that Member States must have assigned an institutional email address associated with the unique country accounts.
- **Partners:** they are users from OAS Observer countries, the private sector, academia, civil society, and international organizations. They can post offers or share good practices as partners and match published cooperation needs.
- **Experts:** they are users willing to provide technical assistance on development issues, which may be internal (OAS) or external experts.

How to access the platform?

- **Log-In:** If you have an account, click on [Log-In](#), and enter your username and password.
- **Register:** If you do not have an account, click on [Register](#), and complete the form.

Membership in the CooperaNet Community must be verified. Once you've registered and submitted your information, you will receive an email from donotreply@oas.org* containing a link to verify and activate your account. This step is required to become a registered user, upload, and access resources shared by other users.

- **Join and select a member role:** click on **"Join"** in your user profile. Fill out the form based on the type of user that best adjusts to your profile (**Member State**, **Partner**, or **Expert** – refer to page 2 for more information) and **submit** your membership request. Permissions will be granted based on your information and after the site administrator reviews and accepts your request.

Sections of the Platform

Cooperanet comprises eight different sections, combining static information sources and interactive features.



Static Sections: The following sections offer basic static information and links to additional sources

- **Home:** This is the platform’s entry point. It features a brief introduction and highlights the latest offers and needs shared through "Cooperation Exchange." It also includes links to all Inter-American Specialized Cooperation Networks of the OAS/SEDI.
- **The Network:** It offers a description of the platform in the About Us section, Legal Information and the Contact Us section. It also includes a Resources section with manuals and videos for Cooperanet users.
- **Development Cooperation Fund:** Offers information on the OAS/DCF, a non-reimbursable funding mechanism that provides seed resources for national and multinational cooperation programs.

Development Cooperation Fund

The OAS Development Cooperation Fund (OAS/DCF) is an innovative non-reimbursable technical cooperation instrument that optimizes multi-sectoral partnerships and alliances in order to provide targeted technical cooperation initiatives that are community-based, locally delivered and responsive to the specific capacity building needs of member states. The Fund, which is capitalized primarily through the voluntary contributions of Member States, also receives contributions from other multi-lateral organizations and partners. In keeping with the organizational approach to integral development, it provides member states options for securing development assistance, as they lead and manage their own socio-economic development based on the priority areas established in the OAS Comprehensive Strategic Plan (Development Pillar).

Over the period 2014-2017, 18 programs were implemented in the areas of Social Inclusion/Social Protection and Productive Employment, with Education, Science and Technology as cross cutting subjects, and total seed funding of \$2.2 billion. The diversity of programs under cycle 2014-2017 supports an extensive reach across different sectors of society and supports SEDI's objective of delivering inclusive development throughout the Americas. As a result, more than 40,000 people in Latin America and the Caribbean benefited from DCF program implementation through programs related to training and integration of vulnerable youth into the labor market, financial empowerment of low-income families, development of inclusive policies for people with disabilities, sustainable livelihoods for farmers, among other areas of interest for member states.

The 2017-2020 programming cycle allocates \$1.5 billion to support the implementation of 18 programs across the region in the three priority areas of the Inter-American Education Agency (SEI), with science and technology as a cross cutting subject. The programs, which are in the early stages of implementation, are expected to strengthen the quality of education being offered in member states, and expand access to vulnerable groups such as women, youth, indigenous persons, and rural communities. Programming is also aligned to support the efforts of member states in the development and strengthening of policies to meet Goal 4 of the 2030 Agenda.

This section includes a brief **description of the Fund**, access and an **essential documents** list on the DCF, and a **list of past and current programs being funded**.

- Development Partners:** Features the different partnerships of the OAS/SEDI to promote the region's integral development. Partners may be governmental institutions from the OAS Member States and Permanent Observer countries and the private sector, academia, civil society, and international organizations.

Exclusive to Partners: Users registered as "Partners" may press the "Request to be featured as Development Partner" button, complete the simple form, and submit it for approval. This form is also accessible through partner profiles.

Partners may be filtered by "Area of Focus."

Partners feature a brief description of their partnership with the OAS, a logo, and a link to their website.

Request to be featured as Development Partner

- Cooperation Authorities:** Offers basic information and profiles of the region's Cooperation Authorities, including entity, name of the Authority, title, and website. In addition, only the *Institutional Unique Accounts that act as Focal Points* can contact each other through the platform, both as a group and directly.

Exclusive to Institutional Unique Accounts (Focal points): Press to contact all focal points at once through a private group available in the Interactive Library.

Exclusive to Institutional Unique Accounts (Focal points): Contact peers directly through country profiles.

When available, Cooperation Catalogues are accessible in the country's profile.


Exclusive to Institutional Unique Accounts: This section is decentralized and is populated by and fully accessible only to the designated Institutional Unique Accounts in each country, who may edit/update the information contained in the Authority's profile.

To edit your country's Authority as an Institutional Unique Account, go to your profile. Go to **“My Authorities”** in the left menu to view a list of the Cooperation Authorities listed for your country. Click on **“Edit”** to update or **“Delete”** or **“+ New Authority”** as needed.



Interactive Sections: The following sections offer opportunities for interaction among development cooperation policy-makers, partners, experts, and practitioners.

- **Cooperation Exchange:** This practical exchange is the core of CooperaNet. It allows Member States' Institutional Unique Accounts and development Partners to make cooperation offers and share good practices, which may be accessed by the other Member States. In addition, all Member State users may indicate cooperation needs.



- **OFFERS (Exclusive to Member States' Institutional Unique Accounts and Partners):** Press **“Make an Offer”** in the Cooperation Exchange Section to be directed to your profile (or you may go directly to your profile) to access and complete the form to add an offer.

- **Connect with an Expert:** A database of internal (OAS) and external experts allows users to seek technical assistance on specific areas of interest.

Experts may be filtered and searched by **country** (Member State or Other), **Type** (Internal or External), and **Area of Expertise** (based on the Areas of Focus).


Users may access additional details by selecting **"View Profile."**

Expert profiles contain relevant information such as years of experience in the region, latest and previous professional experience, academic background, and research and publications.


Users interested in exploring technical assistance may click on **"Connect"** in a specific profile.

Its interactive functionalities enable **discussions** through **groups** (open or private) to expand on the information uploaded to the library. In addition, community members may share events of interest through a **collective calendar**.
