Objective:	<p>To develop technical and financial instruments for effectively managing ecosystems and natural resources with a community-centered approach.</p> <p>To sustainably manage ecosystems through actions that improve water security in transboundary basins and biospheres.</p> <p>To support analysis of the impacts of migration on shared basins and biosphere, with the goal of restoring natural resources and ecological services, reduce vulnerability of migrants, increase resilience, and enhance socioeconomic conditions of communities.</p>
Activities:	Pilots for economic and employment recovery, consolidation of knowledge base, water and environmental diplomacy, awareness and stakeholder engagement, financial strategies.
Cost and Funding:	USD \$4 million. Multi-Donor (\$1.2 M USD in negotiation)
