

## **Magali Rojas Delgado**

Judge Magali Rojas obtained her law degree from the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru (PUCP) in 1992. She holds degrees in public law (2003) and in administrative arbitration (2006) from PUCP and Ricardo Palma University, respectively. In 2009, she completed a master's degree in public administration at the Ortega y Gasset University Institute of Madrid's Complutense University.

Magali Rojas has served as a legal adviser on administrative law in various State entities, such as the Ministry of Women and Social Development (2002-2003); the Superintendency of National Assets (2001-2002); the Ministry of Labor and Social Promotion (2001); the National Compensation and Social Development Fund (2001-2002); the Informal Property Formalization Commission (1999-2001); and the Office of the Comptroller General of the Republic (1993-1997). She worked as an associate in the law firm "Estudio Balci Consultores Asociados S.A." (1997-1999) and as a partner in the law firm "Estudio Aguilar, Rojas & Asociados S.A.C." (2001-2007), in both places in the area of public administrative law.

She has received awards for her outstanding service to the Peruvian State, including the Presidential Recognition as a public service for her work in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Peru (2009); the José Gregorio Paz Soldán Order of Merit of the Diplomatic Service of Peru from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2009); and the Civic Medal of Law award from the Lima Bar Association in recognition of her distinguished career as a champion of democratic principles and the rule of law (2011).

Since 2007 Judge Magali Rojas has been Administrative Legal Advisor to the Office of the Minister, Vice Minister, and Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Peru, working on matters pertaining to monitoring the legality of Administrative Law.

She has been a judge on the OAS Administrative Tribunal since 2011.
